A wild boar eats both plants and meat and is consequently also a predator, which is even unashamed enough to bring down small baby fawns. The wild boar has a sharp ear but poor sight. For this reason it is exceedingly cautious and shy, yet eating meat seems essential to his diet.

The FAULHABER Wild Boar Call produces two important calls:

- **1.** A normal fawn's response call of 1/4 of a second in duration, not falling in pitch or degree of intensity. The caller should inhale a short soft stream of air through the white mouthpiece by which a "FIEP" sound is produced.
 - 2. A "cry of help" produced with a much stronger inhalation which


should fall off steadily. This call indicates urgency, fear, sickness or pain.

After a quiet approach to the high seat and the appropriate preparation, the hunter must keep absolutely quiet for 15 minutes before trying a couple of calls with a pause of approximately 2 minutes in between each call. The hunter must also, at the same time, sharply observe the area. Depending on the situation one can also try the "cry for help" in the same interval pattern as mentioned above. It is highly advisable to have already practiced both calls at home before the hunt.

Warning: a wounded aggressive animal such as the wild boar should only be approached with a loaded, cocked gun as the boar is very tenacious and can rise again.

- The **FAULHABER** calls cannot be disassembled. This ensures a constant pitch.
